Gordon Pryor Eaton was born in Dayton, Ohio, in 1929. He received a B.A. in Geology in 1951 from Wesleyan University and M.S. (1953) and Ph.D. (1957) degrees in Geology from the California Institute of Technology. Eaton's academic career included positions as professor of geology at Wesleyan University and the University of California, Riverside; dean of geosciences at Texas A&M University; president of Iowa State University; and director of Columbia University's Lamont-Doherty Geological Observatory. Beginning in 1963 he also held a variety of positions with the USGS, including Associate Chief Geologist, Reston, Virginia; Scientist in Charge, Hawaiian Volcano Observatory; Deputy Chief, Office of Geochemistry and Geophysics; and Director from 1994 until his retirement in 1997. Many of his professional papers are archived in the Special Collections Department at the Iowa State University Library.
