Raymond C. Moore was born in Roslyn, Washington, in 1892. He received an A.B. degree from Denison University (Ohio) in 1913 and a Ph.D. from the University of Chicago in 1916. He was a USGS staff geologist from 1913 to 1949, and also served on the faculty of the University of Kansas (Lawrence), and as Kansas state geologist and director of the Kansas Geological Survey. Primarily a paleontologist, he was the organizer and editor of the *Treatise on Invertebrate Paleontology* (1953). He also wrote the classic textbooks *Historical Geology* (1933) and *Introduction to Historical Geology* (1949)
