Cyrus F. Tolman was born in Chicago, Illinois, in 1873. He graduated from the University of Chicago in 1896. Tolman served as a professor of geology at the University of Arizona and Stanford University, as Territorial Geologist for Arizona, and as a consulting geologist throughout his career. His areas of investigation included the economic geology of copper, gold, magnesium, and iron deposits in the western United States, and the geology of underground water, for which he wrote a standard textbook. He retired in 1938.
