Harold Wanless was born in Chicago, Illinois, in 1898. He earned B.S., M.S., and Ph.D. degrees from Princeton University in 1920, 1921, and 1923. Wanless joined the faculty of the University of Illinois in 1923 and remained there until his 1967 retirement. His principal areas of research included sedimentary petrology, vertebrate paleontology, and the Pennsylvanian stratigraphy of the United States. From 1953 until his death in 1970 Wanless worked with the USGS on the Paleotectonic Map Project, concentrating on Pennsylvanian systems in the eastern and Midwestern U.S. He was a member of many professional organizations, including the Geological Society of America, the American Association of Petroleum Geologists, the American Geophysical Union, and the American Association for the Advancement of Science.
